

# Arts Award costs and funding, September 2023 – August 2024

Arts Award offers unique qualifications which support young people to develop as artists and arts leaders. The awards support personalised learning and develops transferable skills, such as creativity, communication, leadership and teamwork. Young people aged 25 and under can achieve qualifications at Entry Level (Entry 3) and Levels 1, 2 and 3 on the RQF (Regulated Qualifications Framework). They can also achieve an Arts Award Discover – an introductory level. Arts Award is regulated by Ofqual (Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation) in England, CCEA Regulation in Northern Ireland and by Qualifications Wales. The awarding organisation is Trinity College London.

Arts Award **does not** charge an annual fee to be a registered centre for the awards. The fees outlined here represent the whole cost of training and moderation for centres planning to deliver Arts Award. Once trained, advisers retain this status, giving them the ability to deliver Arts Award in centres they are connected to.

# Moderation/certification fees

Moderation/certification fees are **per portfolio/arts log** submitted and each type of moderation is subject to **minimum/maximum/admin fees** (see below for details). Large group discounts are available for groups of 25+, 50+ or 100+. All moderation fees include a certificate.

#### Standard Moderation

There is a **minimum fee** of £550 for standard moderation. The minimum fee can be reached through <u>any</u> combination of Explore/Bronze/Silver/Gold award levels in one booking. If the minimum fee is not met with the total of the per-person fees, a 'top-up' amount to cover the difference will be charged.

### Online Moderation

There is a **maximum fee** for online moderation: to be eligible for online moderation, the total invoiced per-person fee for your moderation must be <u>below</u> the minimum fee for standard moderation, £550. No minimum fee applies.

## Postal Moderation

An **admin fee** of **£24.00** applies per moderation booking to cover the safe handling, processing and return of the portfolios/arts logs back to centres via tracked delivery.

There is a **maximum fee** for postal moderation: to be eligible for postal moderation, the total invoiced fee for your moderation (the per-person <u>plus</u> admin fee) must be <u>below</u> the minimum fee for standard moderation, £550. No minimum fee applies.
